The scope of the bibliography is limited to material on the history of the natural sciences (mathematics, physical sciences, earth sciences and biological sciences), some of the applied sciences (including medical and health sciences, agriculture, manufacturing and engineering) and human sciences (psychology, anthropology and sociology). Biographical material on practitioners in these sciences is also of interest. In geographic terms, the coverage includes, besides Australia, New Zealand, New Guinea and other islands of the Pacific Ocean near Australia, and Antarctica.

In compiling this bibliography, the sources that proved so valuable to previous compilers were used to search for citations of articles, books and book reviews on subjects covered. As well, journals that had yielded relevant articles in previous years were scanned as likely sources of papers for inclusion. Library catalogues, particularly those of the National Library of Australia and the Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne, were useful sources of relevant material.

Thanks are due to those people who sent items or information about items published in 2007 for inclusion in the bibliography, particularly Professor Rod Home who assiduously searches for material on physics and physicists. Thanks are also due to the staff of the eScholarship Research Centre at the University of Melbourne, especially Helen Morgan, for assistance in making the changeover from one compiler to another so smooth. Readers are invited to continue to send information on the publication of books, journal articles, conference papers, reports, Master's and PhD theses and reviews on the subject published during 2008 for inclusion in future bibliographies.
