This bibliography includes material relating to the history of science in Australia, New Zealand, New Guinea and other islands of the Pacific Ocean near Australia, and Antarctica, mostly published in 2014. For this series of bibliographies history of science broadly covers the natural sciences (mathematics, physical sciences, earth sciences and biological sciences), some of the applied sciences (including medical and health sciences, agriculture and related subjects, and engineering), and human sciences (anthropology and psychology). Biographical material relating to these sciences is also of interest, as are conference proceedings and theses.

The sources used in compiling this Bibliography include those that have proved useful in the past in finding relevant citations. More than 200 journals were scanned for citations to articles and book reviews on subjects covered. The library resources of The University of Melbourne were especially helpful, as were the catalogues of the National Library of Australia, the National Library of New Zealand Te Puna Mātauranga O Aotearoa and the Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne.

Thanks are due to those people who sent items or information about new publications for inclusion in the Bibliography, particularly Professor Rod Home who assiduously alerts the compiler to citations he finds. Thanks are also due to the staff of eScholarship Research Centre, especially Helen Morgan and Ailie Smith, for assistance in producing this bibliography. Dr Monika Wells kindly proofread the draft and made a number of pertinent comments.
