

## News and Notes

Were the rotation of the States for Annual Congresses of the Union adhered to the 1934 Congress would be held in Western Australia. The Council decided that the potential attendance would not justify such a step, and, failing response from State Secretaries and interstate members of Council following upon an invitation to such members to suggest a locality for a camp-out, decided, that in view of the proposed centenary celebrations in Melbourne, the Congress would, this year, be held in Melbourne, followed by a camp-out in Victoria, for preference in the western portion of the State in the hope that South Australian members might co-operate. A sub-committee will arrange details and particulars will be published in the October issue.

The Council has recently passed the following motions:—

(a) That in face of reports of the wholesale illicit (without permit) collecting of eggs of protected birds at the last Camp-out of the R.A.O.U. at Moree, this Council hereby passes a vote of censure on those who flagrantly broke the law, and will by all means in their power take steps to prevent any recurrence of same at future Camps-out of the R.A.O.U.

(b) That the Union make efforts to have all who have not signed the nomination form regularly enrolled, and, in order to obtain recognition and status as *members*, persons rejoining the Union must again sign the nomination form if required by the Council.

All persons whose names are marked with an asterisk on the list of members published with this part are hereby required to sign such form, available on application to the Hon. Treasurer, if they wish to obtain the status referred to.
