Annual Congress and Camp-out

Alterations have been made with regard to the Congress arrangements affecting both the time and place formerly announced.

The programme is now as follows:

Congress, opens in Adelaide, on Thursday, October 29, and continues on followings days with visits to places of interest, lectures, etc.

Leave for Camp on Sunday, November 1, and proceed to Port Pirie and inspect works there. Next day proceed via Port Augusta and Mt. Remarkable and Port Germein to Middleback Station, near Iron Knob, and between Spencer

Gulf and the Gawler Ranges.

Camp continues until November 7 or 8, visits being made to Whyalla and to Iron Knob. "Eastern" and "western" forms of birds meet near the locality of the Camp and interesting "desert" forms occur. Expectations are the Turquoise Wren, Rufous Tree-creeper and the Western Yellow The owner of Middleback Station, who will give the party all assistance possible, states that the surrounding country will be likely to be in splendid condition.
