Preliminary Note on a Victorian Specimen of the Grey-mantled Albatross.—Through the courtesy of Mrs. H. Temple Watts, a specimen of *Phæbetria palpebrata* (Forster) has reached the National Museum, Melbourne. Presumably a storm-blown bird, it was found by a Mr. Miller at Nelson, south-west Victoria, on July 2, 1950. So far as can be ascertained from published accounts, this constitutes the first Australian specimen of the Grey-mantled Albatross. Previous inclusion in the Australian list has been based, apparently, on sight records by Alexander (*Emu*, 17, 41) and MacGillivray (*Emu*, 19, 163) in the Great Australian Bight. Mathews and Iredale (*Manual B. of A.*, 1921, p. 49) state—"Distribution — ?? South Australian Seas. Records by sight, but no skins."—W. B. HITCHCOCK, National Museum, Melbourne, Vic., 5/7/50.
