width of its scope and interest-to research workers in agriculture,

medicine and public health to instance only a few fields.

The material is presented both entomologically and ornithologically, in separate lists, covering 18 orders of insects and 26 of birds. There are 681 pages, of which 78 are devoted to a bibliography. 'Snippets', in the main, with a few more substantial 'entries', represent Australian investigations, and are only referred to here in order to indicate the wide field lying almost untouched.

The title is Check-list and Bibliography on the Occurrence of Insects in Birds' Nests, and the work is available from the Iowa State College Press, Ames, Iowa, U.S.A., at \$8.50.—C.E.B.
