David Calkin, US Forest Service Rocky Mountain Research Station, Missoula

Dave is a supervisory research forester at the Human Dimensions Program of the US Forest Service Rocky Mountain Research Station in Missoula, Montana. He co-leads the Wildfire Risk Management Science team (<https://www.fs.fed.us/rmrs/groups/wildfire-risk-management-team>) working to improve risk based fire management decision making through improved science development, application, and delivery. His research incorporates economics with risk and decision sciences to explore ways to evaluate and improve the efficiency and effectiveness of wildfire management programs.

Dave received a BS in applied math from the University of Virginia, an MS in natural resources conservation from the University of Montana, and his PhD in Economics from Oregon State University. Hayley Hesseln, University of Saskatchewan, Saskatoon

Hayley is an Associate Professor in the College of Agriculture and Bioresources and the head of Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics. She teaches resource and environmental economics and has conducted research on the economics of forestry and forest fires, environmental and resource economics, and workforce development in the north. She has done research on the economics of wildfire and fuels management including an examination of the costs of fuels treatments such as prescribed burning and mechanical fuels reduction. In addition, she has explored the impacts of wildfire in the wildland urban interface, wildland fire policy, and the effects GIS on suppression expenditures. Current research interests include effective pedagogical approaches to learning, and the effects of emotional intelligence in the workforce.



Hayley and Dave have been Associate Editors of the *International Journal of Wildland Fire* since 2015 and 2009 respectively, and Dave has been a member of the *International Association of Wildland Fire* since 2005.
