This *Bibliography* includes material relating to the history of Australian science in the natural sciences (mathematics, physical sciences, earth sciences and biological sciences), some of the applied sciences (including medical and health sciences, agriculture, manufacturing and engineering) and human sciences (anthropology and psychology). Biographical material on practitioners in these sciences is also of interest. In geographic terms, the *Bibliography* covers Australia and its near neighbours (New Zealand, New Guinea and other islands of the Pacific Ocean), and Antarctica.

In compiling this *Bibliography* over 200 journals were scanned for citations for articles, books and book reviews on subjects covered. The resources of the Library at The University of Melbourne and the State Library of Victoria were invaluable in finding significant publications. Library catalogs, particularly those of the National Library of Australia and the National Library of New Zealand Te Papa Mātauranga O Aotearoa, were useful sources of relevant material.

The Compiler is most grateful to those people who has alerted her to new publications via email or providing reprints of articles. Readers often have sources that have not come to the attention of the Compiler, and are encouraged to send information on the publication of books, journal articles, conference papers, reports, Master's and PhD theses and reviews for inclusion in the next *Bibliography*. Thanks are also due to the staff of the eScholarship Research Centre at The University of Melbourne, especially Helen Morgan and Ailie Smith. Dr Monika Wells provided valuable assistance in identifying necessary amendments and corrections.
